Monday	06/08/2018	7.30	<b>The Dambusters (PG)</b> Dir Michael Anderson 1955 (2018 re-release) UK 124 min UK release 16/05/55	A brand-new 75 <sup>th</sup> anniversary restoration of a much-loved British classic with local connections (it was filmed on Derwent reservoir). Michael Anderson's 1955 drama captures the tension and bravery of an audacious raid on the centre of Nazi Germany's industrial complex and the quintessentially English combination of inventiveness and dogged determination.
Monday	13/08/2018	7.30	<b>Sweet Country (15)</b> Dir Warwick Thornton 2017 Australia 113 min UK release 09/03/18	A tense, powerful and beautifully shot Australian western set on the Northern Territory frontier in the 1920s. Indigenous actor Hamilton Morris plays Sam who works at a cattle station run by Fred Smith (Sam Neill) - a Christian pioneer. Fred loans Sam to a neighbouring farm without knowing what this act of comradeship will mean for Sam and his family. Winner of the Venice Film Festival Special Jury Prize 2017.
Monday	20/08/2018	7.30	<b>Lean on Pete (15)</b> Dir Andrew Haigh 2017 UK 121 min UK release 04/05/18	British director Andrew Haigh makes the most of vast American landscapes in this moving film. 15 year-old Charley (brilliantly played by Charlie Plummer) - abandoned by his broken family - gets a summer job working for a dodgy horse-trainer (Steve Buscemi) and falls for fading racehorse Pete. When Pete is destined for the knackers' yard, Charley has a different idea.
Monday	03/09/2018	7.30	<b>In the Fade (18)</b> Dir Fatih Akin 2017 Germany/France 106 min UK release 22/6/18	This year's German entry for the Oscars is the most thrilling and edge-of-the-seat film we've seen for a long time. Katja (Diane Kruger) loses her husband and son in a bomb attack. After a period of mourning she decides that she will bring the perpetrators to trial... With outstanding acting (Best Actress prize for Kruger at Cannes) and brilliant cinematography you will not want to miss this film.
Monday	10/09/2018	7.30	<b>Beast (15)</b> Dir Michael Pearce 2017 UK 107min UK release 27/04/18	Jessie Buckley plays Moll, a beautiful but unhappy young woman living in an island community shaken by a series of murders. She finds herself pulled between the control of her oppressive family (Geraldine James plays her mother Hilary) and the allure of the secretive outsider Pascal (Johnny Flynn) who has a police record.
Monday	17/09/2018	7.30	<b>The Nile Hilton Incident (15)</b> Dir Tarik Saleh 2017 Morocco 111 min UK release 2/3/18	We were gripped by this Cairo crime drama when we saw it at previews recently. Filmed in Casablanca (for reasons that become obvious) and set during the build-up to Egypt's 2011 uprising it follows world-worn detective Noredin (Fares Fares) whose investigation into a murder reveals the underbelly of a city and darker forces. Compellingly acted.
Monday	24/09/2018	7.30	<b>Arcadia (12A)</b> Dir Paul Wright 2017 UK 78 min UK release 08/10/17	This is a special film that has had little exposure but high commendations. Through rare and unseen footage, and a soundtrack by Adrian Utley (Portishead) and Will Gregory (Goldfrapp) we watch the evolving relationship the British have had with their land. Images of local celebrations and festivals to agricultural practices and many other odd things. "Brilliantly constructed".
Monday	01/10/2018	7.30	<b>The Ciambra (15)</b> Dir Jonas Carpignano 2017 Italy 118 min UK release 15/6/18	Pio is a 14 year-old boy growing up in a small Romany community in Calabria, Italy. Desperate to be an adult, he drinks, smokes and is one of the few to befriend the different factions in the region. When his older brother is arrested Pio sets out to prove he's ready to step into his big brother's shoes. With amazing performances from non-professional actors, the film does not romanticise – we found it moving and believable.
